About the Laurel Art Guild

The Laurel Art Guild is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization of people interested in the advancement of the visual arts. Our members are both professional and amateur artists who express themselves through a wide variety of media. The Guild strives to promote growth and excellence for its members and public appreciation for the visual arts through its programs and activities. We are supported by annual dues, commissions on sales from Laurel Art Guild shows, and outside contributions. Since our inception, the Guild has offered scholarships to local high school graduates who are continuing their studies in the Visual Arts.

Founded in 1967, the Guild meets at the Montpelier Arts Center on the grounds of the historic Montpelier Mansion in Laurel, Maryland. These premises are under the jurisdiction of the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission. The Commission's Art Division has been instrumental in the Guild's success through its combined efforts with the Guild in the promotion of classes and workshops as well as juried art shows and other exhibit opportunities.

Meetings are held monthly, September through June at 7:00 pm on the second Monday of the month (second Saturday at 1 pm Dec - Feb) in the Main Gallery of the Montpelier Arts Center. Our meetings afford a wonderful opportunity to learn as well as to meet and exchange ideas with fellow artists. The diverse background of our members lends itself to a very nurturing group that works together to expand the abilities of all.
