December Program

On **December 13, 2021 at 7:00 pm**, photographer **Michael Koren** will show us how to make photos of our paintings using the types of cameras that most of us have, including our smartphones.

Mr. Koren is a free-lance sports and event photographer in the Washington/Baltimore metro area who specializes in youth sports game-time action and team portraits. Prior to this he worked professionally shooting model portfolios, corporate portraits, product photography for catalogs, and client advertising campaigns.

Mr. Koren says "Images, photographs, snapshots, exposures, paintings, drawings, and sketches are all the same, they're pictures. Pictures are part of a visual language that transcends cultures, nationalities, race, religion and possibly species."

Mr. Koren's passion for photography is shared through his skill as a photography educator. He teaches classes at Montgomery College on a variety of photographic topics from mobile photography to street photography. He also teaches smartphone, street and action photography at Capital Photography Center and offers personal instruction. He has led numerous seminars and workshops for local camera clubs, Ritz

Camera, Calumet and the former Washington School of Photography with topics ranging from beginner photography to hands-on advanced level workshops and classes.

Currently Mr. Koren is Director of the Silver Spring Camera Club in Maryland and VP of the Maryland Photography Alliance. He also organizes two Meetup groups dedicated to photography. First, he leads the iPhone Photography Meetup Group on outings around the metro area and offers instruction on best techniques and the latest apps for the mobile camera. Second, the Photographers of the Washington/Baltimore Metro Area group creates a fun, supportive, light-hearted community of people who want to share their passion for photography through photo walks and informal gatherings.




Sharon Sefton
