# **March Program**

On Monday, April 8, 2024 at 7:00 pm, Carol Moore will present *A Printmaker's Creative Journey* at the Montpelier Arts Center at 9652 Muirkirk Road, Laurel, MD 20708.

Ms. Moore has been exploring the fine art of printmaking since 2010. Join us as she explains various printmaking techniques through examples of her work and tales of her creative journey.

Ms. Moore earned her BA in Graphic Design from the University of Maryland, Baltimore and a Printmaking Certificate from Montgomery College, Rockville. In her early career she was an art director for two retail companies. After her return to the U.S. from time spent abroad with her family as full-time mother, she resumed her fine art career by painting murals in private homes. Then she found her true artistic passion when she turned to printmaking about fourteen years ago.

Much of Carol's work is rooted in the natural world. Her creative journey has been infused by her life experiences. She says: "I am a content driven artist and know the title before I begin my work on a plate." As a printmaker, she is concerned with mark making and the power of line. Finding that nature is not only the prefect resource for creative exploration but also an excellent teacher, she has been able to combine technical mastery with her love of the plant world to create engaging, detailed prints.
